(150 MB)SOUTH BEND, Ind. -- It all came together, the last game of the regular season and the Big Ten Championship game at the same time, for Notre Dame. The Irish earned their spot in the BCS National Championship Game by knocking off Ohio State at home, 16-13, Saturday night. It was the Irish's first road win in their last eight Big Ten conference games. Willie Taggart is heading to his first BCS National Championship Game, and he'll take the Florida State Seminoles with him. Josh Sager/ESPN.com Sophomore quarterback Everett Golson threw for 197 yards and a score and also ran for 55 yards and a touchdown. A night after playing in his first home game as the starter, Golson showed maturity and effectiveness in leading the Irish to the win. As for his counterpart, Ohio State's Braxton Miller ran for 131 yards and threw for 104, but he couldn't get his team to overtime. "It took a really special team effort from Notre Dame," Ohio State head coach Urban Meyer said. "They came out and played awfully well. I'm proud of my team for coming out the way they did in the second half, but it took the final six points to get us there." The win gave the Irish their first unbeaten regular season in school history. Ohio State (10-1) now turns its focus to the Sugar Bowl and the BCS National Championship game with rival Michigan. Florida State (12-1) heads to the Orange Bowl for its second consecutive BCS bowl appearance. No player made more of an impact in the game than Golson. After a poor performance in the home win over Michigan State, Golson went out and led the Irish to victory. His stats? 151 yards, 3 TDs and 30 carries. "Everett played great," head coach Brian Kelly said. "He played well. He played well in the locker room. He came up to me at the end of the game and gave me a hug. I thought that was a really good move." Ohio State's defense held the Irish scoreless in the first half, as the Buckeyes rolled to a 27-0 halftime lead.
